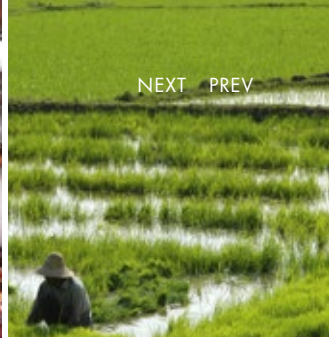

# FAST FACTS

## GEOGRAPHY:

Myanmar is the largest of the mainland Southeast Asian states, stretching its long coastline from the Tibetan border to Thailand's. The Mergui Archipelago comprises of nearly 800 islands in the south west.

## WHEN TO GO:

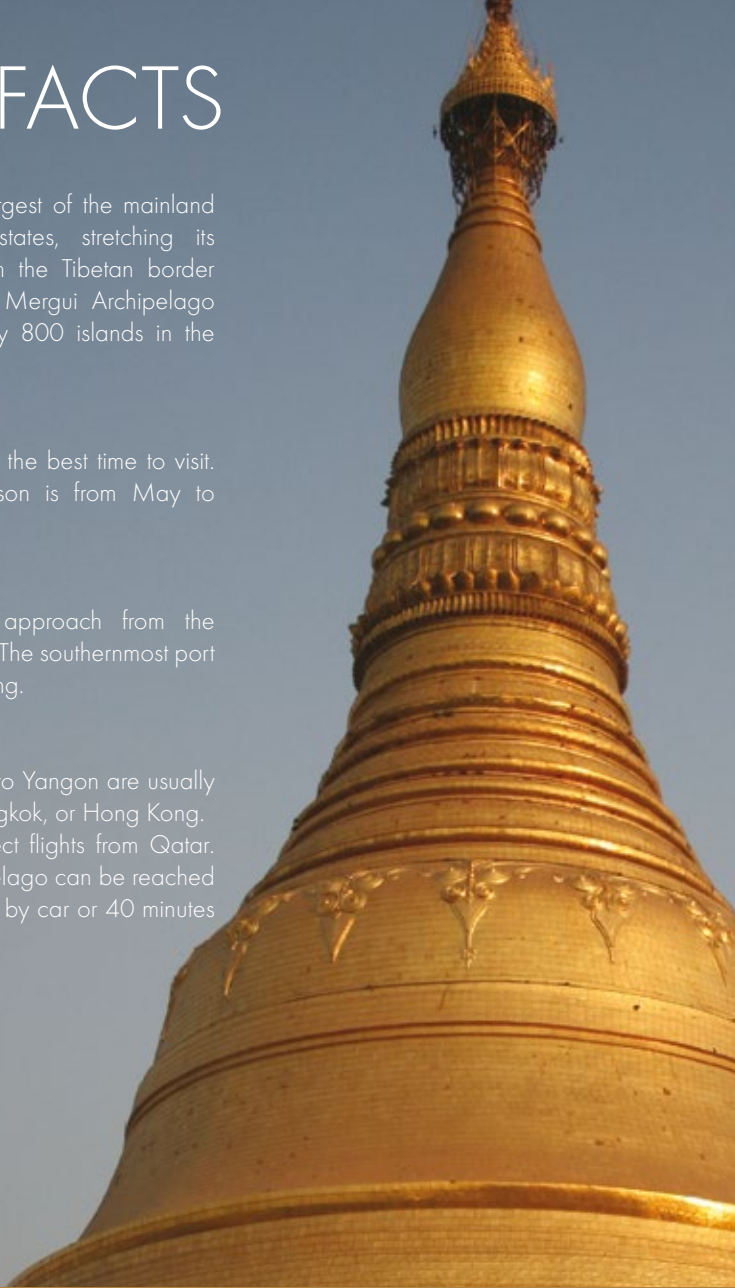
October to May is the best time to visit. The monsoon season is from May to September.

## ENTRY BY YACHT:

Generally yachts approach from the south, via Thailand. The southernmost port of entry is Kawthaung.

## ENTRY BY AIR:

International flights to Yangon are usually via Singapore, Bangkok, or Hong Kong. There are also direct flights from Qatar. The Mergui Archipelago can be reached via Phuket. (4 hours by car or 40 minutes by helicopter).
